Brief summary of matter:

A petition was received in March requesting the reopening of the sluice at Margate with the intention of resolving issues associated with odour from seaweed and sediment in the harbour. A cabinet report dated 31<sup>st</sup> July 2014 discusses the proposals put forward by the petition relating to the sluice and provides a summary of local coastal processes including the interaction with local maritime structures.

## Decision made:

Option 1: To reject the proposal to reopen the sluice for the reasons set out in the cabinet report and to refer this decision to the next meeting of Council.

## Reasons for decision:

Technical evidence suggests that the reopening of the sluice would not resolve the seaweed and sediment odour issue.

Alternatives considered and why rejected:

Study work on the subject of sediment movement and near-shore current and wave conditions indicates that reopening the sluice through the Stone Pier would not resolve the current odour and seaweed deposition issue. It would also have a relatively high cost, would require regular maintenance and increase operational risk.
