1.0 Introduction and Background

- 1.1 Application has been made by Iva Novakova for a premises licence which includes the supply of alcohol on the premises.
- 1.2 The Operating Schedule, showing the proposed licensable activities and hours are appended at Annex 1. A map of the area showing the location of these premises is at Annex 2.

2.0 General Points

- 2.1 Applicants for a premises licence are required, as part of the licensing procedure, to display a public notice which provides information to the public regarding the manner in which objection may be made. Similarly, public notice of the application should be published in a local newspaper circulating in the vicinity of the premises. These requirements appear to have been complied with. No public objections have been received.
- 2.2 The applicant is further required to give notice of the application to responsible authorities. Kent Police have made representations which are appended at Annex 3. Planning have made representations which are appended at Annex 4.
- 2.3 The Licensing Sub-Committee will be aware that it must carry out its functions under the 2003 Licensing Act to take steps which are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Licensing objectives are:- the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm. In carrying out its licensing functions, the Licensing Sub-Committee must also have regard to its statement of licensing policy and the Guidance issued under the Act.
- 2.4 The four licensing objectives are the matters the Licensing Sub-Committee must address when considering whether to grant or refuse the application. Each application should be considered on its merits. Reasons must be given for any decision made by the Sub-Committee.
- 2.5 Where a premises licence is granted mandatory conditions will apply under Sections 19- 21 of the Act. These refer to irresponsible drink promotions, free water, smaller measures available, an age verification policy, the sale of alcohol below cost, and, designated premises supervisor.
- 2.6 The application should be determined within twenty working days beginning with the day after the end of the period during which representations may be made. Representations had to be made by the 2nd November.

3.0 Options

- 3.1 Grant the application with conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule accompanying the application and the conditions mentioned at paragraphs 2.5.
- 3.2 Exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates.
- 3.3 Refuse the application.

- 3.4 Refuse to specify a person in the licence as the designated premises supervisor. The proposed designated premises supervisor is Iva Novakova.
- 3.5 Grant the application subject to different conditions in respect of different parts of the premises or different licensable activities.



The main issue is that there are areas of concern which have not been answered by the applicant. The applicant has been emailed numerous times to answer the concerns

The premises is in a location that is not too far from the busiest night time economy in Thanet and this is why the police have concerns.

The hours being requested do not allow a suitable drink up time which the police feel needs addressing. Also due to the location not enough information about the CCTV system installed.

Without these points being covered the police do not believe the licensing objectives are being met.

The police do not support this application.

Suggested conditions that could be added to the licence to remedy the representation or other suggestions the Licensing Sub Committee may take into account:

If a licence was to be granted then the following conditions would be strongly recommended.

- 1. Sale by retail of alcohol to end at 22:30 hours. This is to allow a drinking up period for your customers.
- 2. I would suggest that all entertainment also ends at this time.
- 3. CCTV that you have installed has a minimum of a 30 day record function. Cameras to be placed inside and overlooking the entrance to the premises. At least one member of staff on duty to understand how to use the CCTV system. Copies made to the police and local authority upon request.
- 4. Clear signage that drinks cannot be taken outside as you are only asking for On sales.

1.0 Introduction and Background

- 1.1 Three temporary event notices have been received from James Johnston of Greenfield Road, Ramsgate. The events are described as 'Mobile bar at Westwood Cross Shopping Centre for the festive season'. There will be the following licensable activities, the sale by retail of alcohol. It is intended that they will take place between 6th and 12th December, 14th and 20th December, 22nd and 28th December, between 9.30 a.m and 7.30 p.m. The maximum number of people to be present will be 150. The applicant is the holder of a personal licence.
- 1.2 Part 5 of the 2003 Licensing Act provides a system of permitted temporary activities, under which licensable activities can be carried out on a temporary basis (for a period not exceeding 7 days) without the need for a premises licence or a club premises certificate. Copies of the notices are appended at Annex 1.

2.0 General Points

- 2.1 The Act provides for periods of notice and the number of events that may be held. Notice must be given to the Licensing Authority, Police and Environmental Protection ten working days before the beginning of the event period. The Police and Environmental Protection then have three working days to lodge objections with the Licensing Authority and Applicant. Copies of the Police objections are appended at Annex 2.
- 2.2 Objections must relate to the undermining of the licensing objectives, the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, the protection of children from harm.

- 3.2 Refuse the application or applications.

Being a mobile bar for ON sales the drinks will not be able to leave this premise. Is there going to be a fenced off area which they plan to use where the alcohol is to be sold. Has the notice been completed incorrectly and it is for OFF sales which would allow patrons to move freely around Westwood Cross consuming alcohol?

The notice also lists the plan to sell craft beer and spirits. The location and time of year for this mobile bar is a serious concern. High percentage ABV being sold where it is at a location where patrons would most likely have driven to the location. This could then cause an increase in potential drink driving related incidents.

If the plan is to allow the free movement of the alcohol after it has been sold how is the applicant going to protect children from harm? How is proxy selling going to be managed? What if a person purchases alcohol, goes into a shop and leaves the vessel outside. Any person could pick that up and consume it. Possible someone under age.

This location is one of the busiest areas in the run up to Christmas. By allowing the sale of alcohol all day causes the Police concerns against the licensing objectives. The notice is also only for 150 people where during this time thousands could be at the location.

There is limited information about this event at this time and therefore the police do not support this application.

The police feel that if the event went ahead then it should be more controlled.

The Police do not feel it will work as ON sales due to being a mobile bar. A fenced off area where the alcohol is purchased and consumed should be put in place. No alcohol to leave this area. This will protect the free movement of alcohol around Westwood Cross.

Thanet is still covered by a DPPO where alcohol cannot be consumed in a public place.

By have a designated area will assist in allowing the applicant to control the numbers they are requesting. Without this it would be impossible to manage it to 150 people.

Due to the time of year only Mulled wine should be sold. By allowing spirits and craft beer at this location do not support the licensing objectives.

- 1.1 Application has been made by Miles Robert Wiseman for variation of a premises licence described as 'at present the licence runs till 3 a.m with the building being empty by 3.30 a.m. The variation would move the 3 a.m to 4 a.m for food and drink sales with the premises being empty at 4.30 a.m. The music will revert to background music from 3 a.m till 4.30 a.m so there is a wind down/slow down place for the more mature customer to go in Thanet. The reasons are delivered by an older large population in Ramsgate of 'DFL's' who expect a more varied timed evening previously had in London'.
- 1.2 The Operating Schedule, showing the proposed variation to hours is appended at Annex 1.
- 1.3 These premises were granted a premises licence in May 2014 which remains in force. This licence was last varied in March 2016. A copy of that licence and conditions are appended at Annex 2. The designated premises supervisor is Miles Robert Wiseman.

2.0 General Points

- 2.1 Applicants for variation of a premises licence are required, as part of the licensing procedure, to display a public notice which provides information to the public regarding the manner in which objection may be made. Similarly, public notice of the application should be published in a local newspaper circulating in the vicinity of the premises. These requirements appear to have been complied with. No public objections have been received.
- 2.2 The applicant is further required to give notice of the application to responsible authorities. Kent Police and Environmental Health have made representations which are appended at Annex's 3 and 4.
- 2.3 The Licensing Sub-Committee will be aware that it must carry out its functions under the 2003 Licensing Act to take steps which are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Licensing objectives are:- the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm. Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-

- a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Films

The admission of children (persons under 18 years) to the exhibition of any film is restricted in accordance with any recommendation of the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) or the Licensing Authority.

Where a film exhibition has not been classified, the licence holder will certify to the Licensing Authority that an assessment of the suitability of the film for exhibition to children, in accordance with the BBFC Guidelines has been carried out, and that this has been confirmed by the Licensing Authority, in writing, prior to public viewing.

Any Door Supervisor employed at the premises will be licensed under the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

- 1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."
- 5. (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula –

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

where -

- i. P is the permitted price,
- ii. D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - i. The holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii. The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

- 1. A comprehensive CCTV system shall be installed at the premises. This shall include the inside of the premises and the outside seating area. The images shall be of evidential quality and the data will be retained for a minimum of 28 days. Downloads shall be made available to the Police and authorised officers of the Council upon reasonable request if not immediately within 24 hours.
- 2. A minimum of one Security Industry Approved door supervisor shall be employed at the premises from 11pm until close of trading on Friday and Saturday.
- 3. Live music shall be indoors only and unamplified.
- 4. Recorded music shall be indoors only.

This application to vary the premises licence for The Arch #9 is not supported by the Police.

The Premises is seeking to increase the hours in which it would like to sell alcohol.

Currently the hours to sell alcohol are to 0300 hours and are looking to extend to 0400 hours and to close at 0430 hours.

Also looking to increase the hours on Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, New Year's Eve and the Friday, Saturday and Sunday of national bank holidays to 0500 hours and close 0530 hours. Currently they already have sale by retail of alcohol to 0400 hours on these key dates.

The concern for this application is not only the possible increase of footfall in the area as it would be the latest opening premises in the area. This could cause further crime and disorder or noise complaints to local residents.

There are many incidents and complaints that occur around this location. Incidents are not connected to this premise however this location is around the busiest and most problematic area for the night time economy in Thanet.

If this licence was to be granted it could cause an increase in incidents, connected to noise complaints, drunkenness and ASB.

A domino effect is also a strong possibility with other premises keen to adapt to similar hours if granted. This would first start with premises that sell alcohol and would then be premises with late night refreshments. In turn keeping a number of people who have mostly been consuming alcohol in a high residential area later at night. This is already a serious concern due to the number of incidents and complaints.

The police do not feel this application will support the licensing objectives.


Background

- 1.1 Environmental Health have attempted to call Mr Wiseman to advise our position regarding his proposed variation to increase live and recorded music until 4.15am and consumption of alcohol to 4am both being extended further on Christmas Eve, Boxing day, New Year's Eve and Fri, Sat, Sunday every Bank Holiday weekend to 5.15am. Currently these activities are permitted until 3am.
- 1.2 Recently, licence applications and enquiries to extend operating hours beyond 3am have been received from The Goose, Clique Bar and Rokka. All application were subsequently retracted following discussions with EH and the police or refused.
- 1.3 Environmental Health are concerned about the potential for noise outbreak and noise from patrons causing a public nuisance to residents in the local vicinity and would not support any extension beyond 3am, particularly in this location which is already saturated with licensed premises and would increase the potential for public nuisance over a wider area.
- 1.4 Ramsgate seafront has numerous licensed premises, all of which are licensed to supply alcohol after midnight (Appendix 1) contributing to a vibrant night time economy. Although this brings benefits to our local economy but at the same time generates additional costs for the council, police and other partners.
- 1.5 Environmental Health is mindful of the balance between the competing needs of our residents and those of our business community. However it is essential to ensure our residents are not unreasonably impacted by public nuisance and can enjoy their homes and environment. As there is little separation of commercial and residential areas in much of Ramsgate, this often means that our residents suffer the impacts of the late night economy, particularly in the radiating residential roads which take the brunt of local residents returning home from a night out. Also there are 21 residential boats residing within the harbour and benefit from very little sound insulation or separating distance.
- 1.6 Environmental Health is unable to suggest conditions to mitigate against public disturbance. The only effective control is through premise closure times.
- 1.7 It is clear that residents in Ramsgate are already impacted significantly and that the Council already supports the night time economy. It is our view that no further increases to opening times or encouragement through increasing regulated entertainment should be permitted.

Conclusion

Environmental Health would request that Members refuse any extension to current premise licence because of concerns that patrons congregating outside and on dispersal could cause a public nuisance to many people residing in the area.

1.0 Introduction and Background

- 1.1 Application has been made by Clare Amanda Cook for variation of a premises licence described as 'to vary our opening times and sale of alcohol along with the times of recorded music. Premises has not changed. We are a café bar that serves food, hot & cold drinks and alcohol. The sale of alcohol off the premises is for customers that wish to buy our wine to take home to consume. Our clientel is age 35+'.
- 1.2 The Operating Schedule, showing the proposed variation to hours is appended at Annex 1.
- 1.3 These premises were granted a premises licence in December 2013 which remains in force. This licence was last varied in June 2014. A copy of that licence and conditions are appended at Annex 2. The designated premises supervisor is Clare Amanda Cook.

2.0 General Points

- 2.1 Applicants for variation of a premises licence are required, as part of the licensing procedure, to display a public notice which provides information to the public regarding the manner in which objection may be made. Similarly, public notice of the application should be published in a local newspaper circulating in the vicinity of the premises. These requirements appear to have been complied with. No public objections have been received.
- 2.2 The applicant is further required to give notice of the application to responsible authorities. Environmental Health have agreed a number of matters with the applicant which are set out in an email which is appended at Annex 3. Planning have made representations which are appended at Annex 4.
- 2.3 The Licensing Sub-Committee will be aware that it must carry out its functions under the 2003 Licensing Act to take steps which are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Licensing objectives are:- the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm. In carrying out its licensing functions, the Licensing Sub-Committee must also have regard to its statement of licensing policy and the Guidance issued under the Act.





Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-

- a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Any Door Supervisor employed at the premises will be licensed under the Private Security Industry Act 2001.

- 1.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any

promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in

a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- i) beer or cider: half pint;
- ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

1. CCTV to be fitted to a standard agreed to by the police that complies with The CCTV Code of Practice (2008 edition) produced by the Information Commissioners Office, with all public areas, including all access and egress points covered.

The CCTV system will be maintained and serviced on a regular basis and records kept to that effect.

CCTV shall be operational at all time that members of the public and/or staff are on the premises.

Images will be retained for a period of at least one calendar month by whatever means the licence holder deems appropriate.

The Police or Local Authority will have access to these images at any reasonable time.

The Police or Local Authority will be allowed to take a recording by way of tape, CD Rom or any other means immediately on the request being made.

Staff will be fully trained in the CCTV system and there will be at least one member of staff on duty during trading hours who is able to provide a recording of any incident at the request of police or local authority.

2. A minimum of one Security Industry Approved door supervisor will be employed at the premises from 11pm until close of trading on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays.

Following a site visit this morning and a discussion with the applicant around Environmental Health concerns of potential for public nuisance; the applicant has agreed to the following:

- To remove live music from Section E provision of regulated entertainment. This enables the applicant to have live music internally until 11pm in accordance with the Live Music Act. In the summer I understand that the applicant may want acoustic / duets externally and I have explained that to avoid potential for nuisance this must be unamplified.
- To remove 'both' from Section F Recorded Music and replace with 'indoors'. Advice has been given to the applicant that background music is not a licensable activity; background is accepted by acoustic consultants as not exceeding a music noise level of 5dB LAeq(5mins) above background L90 when music is off in Laymen's terms a person should not need to raise their voice to be heard above the music.

Given that the venue is not adjoined to any residential property, has air condition already in place and door closures fitted and with the attachment of the following agreed condition EH have no objection to the proposed application.

Condition:

1. All windows and doors to be kept closed during regulated entertainment; other than for access and egress.

Do I have a significant interest and if so what action should I take?

A significant interest is an interest (other than a DPI or an interest in an Authority Function) which:

- Affects the financial position of yourself and/or an associated person; or Relates to the determination of your application for any approval, consent, licence, permission or registration made by, or on your behalf of, you and/or an associated person;
- And which, in either case, a member of the public with knowledge of the relevant facts would reasonably regard as being so significant that it is likely to prejudice your judgment of the public interest.

An associated person is defined as:

- A family member or any other person with whom you have a close association, including your spouse, civil partner, or somebody with whom you are living as a husband or wife, or as if you are civil partners; or
- Any person or body who employs or has appointed such persons, any firm in which they
 are a partner, or any company of which they are directors; or
- Any person or body in whom such persons have a beneficial interest in a class of securities exceeding the nominal value of £25,000;
- Any body of which you are in a position of general control or management and to which you are appointed or nominated by the Authority; or
- any body in respect of which you are in a position of general control or management and which:
 - exercises functions of a public nature; or
 - is directed to charitable purposes; or
 - has as its principal purpose or one of its principal purposes the influence of public opinion or policy (including any political party or trade union)

An Authority Function is defined as: -

- Housing where you are a tenant of the Council provided that those functions do not relate particularly to your tenancy or lease; or
- Any allowance, payment or indemnity given to members of the Council;
- Any ceremonial honour given to members of the Council
- Setting the Council Tax or a precept under the Local Government Finance Act 1992

If you are at a meeting and you think that you have a significant interest then you <u>must</u> declare the existence **and** nature of the significant interest at the commencement of the

matter, or when the interest has become apparent, or the declarations of interest agenda item.

Once you have declared that you have a significant interest (unless you have been granted a dispensation by the Standards Committee or the Monitoring Officer, for which you will have applied to the Monitoring Officer prior to the meeting) you **must:-**

- Not speak or vote (unless the public have speaking rights, or you are present to make representations, answer questions or to give evidence relating to the business being discussed in which case you can speak only)
- 2. Withdraw from the meeting during consideration of the matter or immediately after speaking.
- 3. Not seek to improperly influence the decision.

Gifts, Benefits and Hospitality

Councillors must declare at meetings any gift, benefit or hospitality with an estimated value (or cumulative value if a series of gifts etc.) of £25 or more.
