Licensing,

I have received the above TEN applications to comment on behalf of Environmental Health.

I have received the following report from our Building Control Department.

I note that the roof of the seated shelter in this exposed sea front location has been subjected to decades of corrosive wind driven rain and salts it is supported by cast iron with signs of corrosion

Therefore I confirm that by observation survey:-

1. *The seated shelter roof should not be used other than for ordinary walk on use*
2. *Due to possible corrosion it is not structurally adequate for dynamic crowd loading due to excessive dynamic live loadings (crowd loading)*
3. *For events it should be fenced off.*

Based on their report I would object to both the TEN applications on the grounds of public safety.
