"When the Court ordered Thanet District Council to pay compensation, the claimants stated their claim at £1.5 million. This has now risen to £4.7 million plus costs estimated at £1.5 million.

Will the Council now conduct an independent, publicly accessible enquiry into the handling of this claim?"

- 1.4 A Member may, in accordance with Council Procedure Rule 14.8, ask one supplementary question without notice to the Member to whom the first question was asked. The supplemental question must arise directly out of the original question or the reply.

1.5 The questioner shall have two minutes for the initial question and one minute for the supplementary question and the respondent shall have five minutes for the initial reply and two minutes for the supplementary reply. (Council Procedure Rule 14.9 refers)

For Decision

1.0 Introduction

1.1 This report will outline the changes needed as a result of resignation of Cllr Leys as a Councillor and the subsequent election of Cllr Roy Potts and him joining the UKIP Group. In addition Cllr Smith and Cllr Collins of the Democratic Independent Group have both resigned as Councillors.

2.0 Political Balance

2.1 As mentioned above Cllr R Potts has joined the UKIP Group and Cllr Smith and Cllr Collins have left the Democratic Independent Group. The changes to political balance as a result of this are shown in the table below:

- 2.2 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 requires the Council to allocate seats on committees to political Groups in accordance with the size of each group on the Council as a whole and in accordance with the following principles which should be observed as far as is reasonably practicable:
 - a) That not all seats on the same committee are allocated to the same political group;
 - b) That the majority of the seats on a committee are allocated to a particular political group if the number of persons belonging to that group is a majority of the Council's membership;

- c) That, subject to a) and b) above, the number of seats on committees allocated to each political group bears the same proportion of the total of all the seats on committees:
- d) That, subject to a), b) and c) above, the number of seats on a committee allocated to each political group bears the same proportion to the number of all seats on that committee.
- 2.3 For the purposes of political balance a Group is required to have at least two members and to have been formally constituted as a political group before the meeting.
- 2.4 Democratic Services have contacted the five group Leaders and a consensus on a way to achieve proportionality has not been achieved and the options for achieving proportionality are outlined at paragraphs 2.5 to 2.9 below.

2.5 Option 1

2.5.1 That one seat is removed from the Licensing Board and as a result the DIG group loses it seat on that Committee. That an additional seat has been added to the Overview and Scrutiny Panel and that seat is allocated to the UKIP group. That an additional seat is added to the Governance and Audit Committee and that seat is allocated to the UKIP group. That two seats are removed from the Electoral Arrangements Working Party and as a result the UKIP group loses a seat on that Committee and the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee. That two seats are removed from the Constitutional Review Working Party and as a result the UKIP group loses a seat on that Committee and the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee

2.6 **Option 2**

2.6.1 That one seat is removed from the Licensing Board and as a result the Conservative Group loses a seat on that Committee. That an additional seat has been added to the Overview and Scrutiny Panel and that seat is allocated to the UKIP group. That a seat is removed from the Governance and Audit Committee and as a result the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee. That two seats are removed from the General Purposes Committee and as a result the UKIP group loses a seat on that Committee and the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee. That two seats are removed from the Constitutional Review Working Party and as a result the UKIP group loses a seat on that Committee and the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee

2.7 **Option 3**

2.7.1 That one seat is removed from the Licensing Board and as a result the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee. That one seat is removed from the Overview and Scrutiny Panel and as a result the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee. That one seat is removed from the Governance and Audit Committee and as a result the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee.

2.8 **Option 4**

2.8.1 That two seats are added to the Planning Committee and one of those seats is given to the UKIP group and the other given to the DIG group. That one seat is removed from the Licensing Board and as a result the Conservative group loses a seat on that

Committee. That one seat is removed from the Overview and Scrutiny Panel and as a result the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee. That a seat is removed from the Governance and Audit Committee and as a result the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee. That two seats are removed from the General Purposes Committee and as a result the UKIP group loses a seat on that Committee and the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee. That two seats are removed from the Constitutional Review Working Party and as a result the UKIP group loses a seat on that Committee and the DIG group loses its seat on that Committee.

2.9 **Option 5**

- 2.9.1 That another solution that achieves proportionality is agreed. Note that if an alternative proposal is developed during the meeting, compliance with the proportionality rules would need to be verified by officers.

- 2.12 The changes to the political balance calculations do not affect the current proportionality of the Joint Transportation Board or the Standards Committee.

3.0 Recommendation

4.0 Nominations of Members to serve on Committees

- 4.1 Members are reminded that Section 16 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 states that where the Council has determined the allocation to different groups of the seats to which the Act applies, it shall be the duty of the authority to give effect to a Group's wishes about who is to be appointed to the seats that they have been allocated.
- 4.2 Therefore the corresponding amendments to group nominations as outlined below must also be made.

4.3 **Option 1**

The UKIP group will lose a seat on the Boundary and Electoral Arrangements Working Party and so will have to remove one Councillor from that Working Party. The DIG Group will also lose a seat on the Boundary and Electoral Arrangements Working Party and so Cllr Elenor will lose his seat on that Working Party. The UKIP group will lose a seat on the Constitutional Review Working Party and so will have to remove one Councillor from that Working Party. The DIG Group will also lose a seat on the Constitutional Review Working Party and so Cllr Elenor will lose his seat on that Working Party.

These appointments are until the Thanet Association of Parish Council Annual General Meeting in November 2016.
