1.0 Introduction and Background

- 1.1 An application has been received for the review of the premises licence held by Tamim Rahmani, in respect of the premises known as 555 Pizza, 15 Northwood Road, Ramsgate from Chief Inspector Sharon Adley, Kent Police.
- 1.2 These premises were granted a premises licence in August 2007. A copy of the premises licence is appended at Annex 1. A map of the area showing the location of these premises is at Annex 2.
- 1.3 Licensable activities are shown on that premises licence and the times can be found at Annex 1, together with the conditions attached to the licence.
- 1.4 The grounds for review of the licence are set out in the application, which is appended at Annex 3.

2.0 General Points

- 2.1 Applicants for review of a premises licence are required, as part of the licensing procedure, to send copies of the application to other responsible authorities. The Licensing Authority must advertise the review for twenty eight days, giving interested parties the opportunity to make representations. Representations have been received from Trading Standards which are appended at Annex 4. No further representations have been received. The application was advertised by notice on the premises and on the public notice board in the Gateway, the main Council Offices.
- 2.2 On the 27th June last an application to transfer the premises licence to Faiz Rahmani was lodged with the Licensing Department. That transfer was returned to the applicant as it was not valid.
- 2.3 Before determining the application, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to consider it and any relevant representations. The Authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such steps, if any, mentioned under 'options' at paragraph 3, it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The Guidance issued by the Home Office should also be considered.
- 2.4 The licensing objectives are the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and the protection of children from harm. Reasons must be given for any decision made by the Sub-Committee.

3.0 Options

- 3.1 To modify the conditions of the licence (for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted or any new condition is added).
- 3.2 To exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence.
- 3.3 To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months.
- 3.4 To revoke the licence.
- 3.5 To take none of these steps and take no action, or, take informal action such as a warning or guidance.



Tamim Rahmani is the premises licence holder of 555 Pizza, Northwood Road, Ramsgate. Where a serious sexual assault took place at the accommodation above this premises. Of which Rahmani had control over.

The Police are asking for revocation of the premises licence.

In the early hours of Sunday 18th September 2016 the premises licence holder Rahmani along with 3 other males were out walking and have approached a lone 16 year old female in the street. This female was vulnerable as she was lost and has asked them for help in finding her destination.

Rahmani and the other 3 males offered to show the female where she needed to go. The female has trusted Rahmani and the 3 other males that they would help her. While walking with the female one of these males started to touch her inappropriately. The female is 16 years of age with 4 adult men who she did not know and she has become scared. Instead of assisting her, they taken her to the premises and have taken her to the flat directly above. She has then been subject to a horrific ordeal and was raped repeatedly by Rahmani and the 3 other men.

The premises licence holder Rahmani and the three other males have been convicted of rape at Canterbury Crown Court.

Rahmani the premises licence holder is now a convicted rapist.

This offence was carried out on a young vulnerable female who was lost and has trusted Rahmani and the other 3 males, they implied that they would help her but have then abused that level of trust in the gravest way possible and repeatedly raped this female. After the ordeal the female was told to leave and left on her own. The female has left scared, lost and has sought refuge by someone who has helped her.

The premises licence has stayed in Rahmani's name for this whole time. No effort from him or his family in getting this changed. He is eminently not a suitable person to hold any premises licence. Following the arrest and ongoing court case, there has been significant public interest in the premises. Police have been called to demonstrations outside the premises and have concerns regarding future demonstrations and the potential for future disorder outside.

The premises are under control of a convicted rapist. In the circumstance above it cannot be allowed to continue to operate under its existing licence as there has been arguably the most serious breach of all four licensing objectives.

The Police believe that revocation is the only alternative to this premises licence.

The Trading Standards Department of Kent County Council as a responsible authority under the Licensing Act 2003, and hereby make representation in relation to licensing objectives, in connection with the application in relation for review of the premises of 555 Pizza, 15 Northwood Road, Ramsgate.

I can confirm that Trading Standards holds no other relevant material to be added to this review, however having reviewed the material contained within the Kent Police application for review, this department concludes with the view that the current premises licence is untenable in its current form.

The information provided identifies that the premises licence holder has been convicted through the criminal courts and as per the Licensing Act S182 guidance in paragraph 11.25 this fact is to be treated as undisputed.

The review also details that the four males involved utilized the premises and the attached domestic premises in order to commit the crime, therefore the facts identify that not only has the premises beence holder committed a crime, but indeed the ligensed premises has been used in part in committing it.

Given the options available to a licensing sub-committee, this department concludes that revocation of the premises licence is the only proportionate outcome.

1.0 Introduction and Background

- 1.1 A temporary event notice has been received from Justin Newin of Sittingbourne for Mecca Bingo, Westwood Cross, Broadstairs. The event is described as 'Bingo and entertainment including live band and DJ'. There will be the following licensable activities, the sale by retail of alcohol, the provision of regulated entertainment and late night refreshment. It is intended that it will take place on the 20th August between midnight and 2 a.m. The maximum number of people to be present will be 499. The applicant is the holder of a personal licence.
- 1.2 Part 5 of the 2003 Licensing Act provides a system of permitted temporary activities, under which licensable activities can be carried out on a temporary basis (for a period not exceeding 7 days) without the need for a premises licence or a club premises certificate. A copy of the notice is appended at Annex 1.

2.0 General Points

- 2.1 The Act provides for periods of notice and the number of events that may be held. Notice must be given to the Licensing Authority, Police and Environmental Protection ten working days before the beginning of the event period. The Police and Environmental Protection then have three working days to lodge objections with the Licensing Authority and Applicant. A copy of the Police objection is appended at Annex 2.
- 2.2 Objections must relate to the undermining of the licensing objectives, the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, the protection of children from harm.
- 2.3 A copy of the premises licence for Mecca Bingo with times and conditions is at Annex 3.



No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-

- a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- 1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can

reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."
- 5. (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula —

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

where -

- i. P is the permitted price,
- ii. D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- iii. V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - i. The holder of the premises licence,
 - ii. The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - iii. The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

The admission of children (persons under 18 years) to the exhibition of any film is restricted in accordance with any recommendation of the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) or the Licensing Authority.

Where a film exhibition has not been classified, the licence holder will certify to the Licensing Authority that an assessment of the suitability of the film for exhibition to children, in accordance with the BBFC Guidelines has been carried out, and that this has been Confirmed by the Licensing Authority, in writing, prior to public viewing

2.0 General Points

- 2.2 Objections must relate to the undermining of the licensing objectives, the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, the protection of children from harm.
