This application to vary the conditions are not supported by the Police.

The Premises is seeking to increase the hours in which it would like to sell alcohol. Currently the hours are to 2300 hours and this was only agreed as recently as July 2015.

Another application to vary this condition now wants to trade for 24 hours.

This premise is in a high crime area where one of the biggest factors is the sale of alcohol.

The applicant has agreed that all alcohol from 2300 hours would be served through the hatch.

Underage drinking and intoxicated people frequent this street and having a premise that is allowed to sell alcohol for 24 hours brings serious concerns. Because of this the police do not feel it will support the licensing objectives.

The police do not support this application.

## Suggested conditions that could be added to the licence to remedy the representation or other suggestions the Licensing Sub Committee may take into account:

If a licence was to be granted then the following conditions would be strongly recommended.

- 1, Hours of trade to be extended from 2300 hours to 0000 hours only for the of alcohol. Any sale of alcohol during this time to be served through the serving hatch only.
- 2, CCTV to be installed and to work, record and be maintained. Allowing for 30 days Recording.
