Background

Angela's of Margate is a sustainable fish restaurant that places environmental and community welfare at its core. Its ethos is to provide a quality dining experience that minimises its impact on both the local area and within the wider context of environmental issues currently experienced globally. It is intended to achieve a zero to landfill Waste Management policy. Neither the sale of alcohol nor the provision of regulated entertainment are considered core elements of the premises.

Definitions

The Premises" means the areas outlined in red on Appendix 1 - Licensable Area.

Responsible Authorities" has the meaning ascribed to that expression by the Licensing Act 2003 as amended.

Licensable Activities

No regulated entertainment shall be provided and no alcohol shall be sold other than within the area described as The remises and shown on the plan in Appendix 1 as being within the red line. Alcohol may be consumed on the outside terrace.

With reference to the plan and notwithstanding the hours permitted by the Licence, Licensable Activities shall be restricted as follows:-

Regulated Entertainment: Monday to Sunday 10:00 – 00:00

Late Night Refreshment: Monday to Sunday 23:00 – 00:00

Sale of Alcohol: Monday – Sunday 10:00 – 00:00

Duration of the Licence

A perpetual licence is being sought commencing as soon as permitted but ideally by the 1st June 2017.

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Other General Conditions

In addition to the rights of entry prescribed by the Licensing Act, all civilian licensing officers employed by the Police or Licensing Authority shall be allowed access to the site as if they were Police Officers.

c) The prevention of crime and disorder

Notwithstanding the mandatory conditions relating to the sale of alcohol, the holder of the licence shall insure that:

Angela's of Margate operates under Challenge 25 at all times.

No sale of alcohol will be made to any persons who are intoxicated or behaving in an unruly fashion.

That any refusal of service is recorded in a Refusal Book which will be made available to the authorities if required.

At all times alcohol is seen as ancillary to the sale of food but is not restricted to those purchasing food. However given the nature and size of the premises, the amount of customers who purchase a drink without food will be negligible.

c) Public safety

At all times that the outside terrace is used for customer seating a dedicated server will be employed to ensure that glass and litter does not accumulate and that tables are kept clean and tidy at all times. Any rubbish, caused by Angela's or a third party will be removed immediately so as not pose a public hazard.

A nominated individual within the company will be appointed to oversee all matters relating to Health and Safety. This will include undertaking Risk Assessments for all activities, testing fire alarm and evacuation systems and procedures and ensuring that an appropriate Food Management System is adopted.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Music will be background and will not impact of residents and neighbours.

External seating areas will be kept tidy and tables and chairs will be arranged in such a way as to not cause obstruction to public highways. A licence will be applied for external seating.

e) The protection of children from harm

Age Verification Policy

The mandatory condition relating to the requirement to have in place an age verification policy shall be amended so that it shall apply to any person appearing to be under the age of 25 as opposed to the age of 18 and shall apply to the sale or supply of alcohol.

Staff shall be instructed to require proof of age before serving any person whom they suspect of being under the age of 25. Passport, photography driving licence or UK ID Card bearing the PASS logo.

Given that it is not intended to provide any entertainment of an adult nature and against the background of the other legislative provisions, the applicant does not consider that any further specific provision relating to protecting children from harm is necessary.

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NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

 - A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
 - A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
 - A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
 - A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
 - A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
 - A **full** birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's parents or adoptive parents, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
 - A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
 - A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
 - A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
