Executive Summary:

This report outlines the changes needed to proportionality and committees as a result of the sad death of Councillor Howes and Cllr Brimm leaving the Thanet Independent Councillors Group. It suggests a number of options for Council to choose from in order to restore proportionality and allows an opportunity for Group Leaders to make new and adjust existing nominations to committees.

1.0 Introduction

1.1 This report outlines the changes needed to proportionality and committees as a result of the sad death of Councillor Howes and Cllr Brimm leaving the Thanet Independent Councillors Group.

2.0 Political Balance

2.1 The current political balance of the Council is shown in the table below:

- 2.2 The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 requires the Council to allocate seats on committees to political Groups in accordance with the size of each group on the Council as a whole and in accordance with the following principles which should be observed as far as is reasonably practicable:
 - a) That not all seats on the same committee are allocated to the same political group;
 - b) That the majority of the seats on a committee are allocated to a particular political group if the number of persons belonging to that group is a majority of the Council's membership;

- c) That, subject to a) and b) above, the number of seats on committees allocated to each political group bears the same proportion of the total of all the seats on committees:
- d) That, subject to a), b) and c) above, the number of seats on a committee allocated to each political group bears the same proportion to the number of all seats on that committee.
- 2.3 For the purposes of political balance a Group is required to have at least two members and to have been formally constituted as a political group before the meeting.
- 2.4 Democratic Services have contacted the four group Leaders and consensus has not been achieved, therefore four options are being presented to this meeting. These are outlined at paragraphs 2.5 to 2.8. However if Members wished to propose an alternative they can do under option 4 at paragraph 2.9, however compliance with the proportionality rules would need to be verified by officers, prior to it being adopted.

2.5 Option 1

2.5.1 That the Thanet Independent Councillors Group lose a seat on the Planning Committee and the UKIP and Independent Group gain that seat. That the Thanet Independent Councillors Group also lose a seat on the Licensing Board and that seat is given to the Conservative group.

2.6 **Option 2**

2.6.1 That the Thanet Independent Councillors Group lose a seat on the Planning Committee and the UKIP and Independent Group gain that seat. That a seat is added to the Licensing Board and that seat is given to the Conservative Group. That a seat is removed from the Governance and Audit Committee and the Thanet Independent Councillors Group loses that seat.

2.7 **Option 3**

2.7.1 That the Thanet Independent Councillors Group lose a seat on the Planning Committee and the UKIP and Independent Group gain that seat. That a seat is removed from the Governance and Audit Committee and the Thanet Independent Councillors Group loses that seat. That a seat is added to the General Purposes Committee and that seat is given to the Conservative Group.

2.8 **Option 4**

- 2.8.1 That another solution that achieves proportionality is agreed. Note that if an alternative proposal is developed during the meeting, compliance with the proportionality rules would need to be verified by officers.
- 2.9 The tables below show the change to numbers serving on Committees as a result of these proposals:

2.11 Recommendation

2.11.1 That Council agrees one of the options outlined at paragraphs 2.5 – 2.9 to achieve proportionality.

3.0 Nominations of Members to serve on Committees

- 3.1 Members are reminded that Section 16 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 states that where the Council has determined the allocation to different groups of the seats to which the Act applies, it shall be the duty of the authority to give effect to a Group's wishes about who is to be appointed to the seats that they have been allocated.
- 3.2 Therefore the corresponding amendments to group nominations as outlined below must also be made.

3.3 Option 1

3.3.1 That the Thanet Independent Councillors Group loses a seat on the Planning Committee and so must remove a nomination to that Committee. The UKIP group gain a seat on the Planning Committee and so must make a new nomination to that committee. That the Thanet Independent Councillors Group lose a seat from the Licensing Board and so must remove a nomination to that Committee. The Conservative group gain a seat on the Licensing Board and so must make a new nomination to that Committee.

Councillor Brimm was a member of the Licensing Board and the Boundary and Electoral Arrangements Working Party and so the Thanet Independent Councillors Group need to make new nominations to both of these Committees.

We have also been informed by the Leader that he wishes to change his nominations to the Joint Transportation Board and would like to replace Councillor Parsons with Councillor M Saunders.

3.4 Option 2

3.4.1 That the Thanet Independent Councillors Group loses a seat on the Planning Committee and so must remove a nomination to that Committee. The UKIP group gain a seat on the Planning Committee and so must make a new nomination to that committee. That a seat is added to the Licensing Board and that seat is given to the Conservative Group and so will need to make a nomination to the Board. That a seat is removed from the Governance and Audit Committee and the Thanet Independent Councillors Group lose that seat and so must remove a nominee from that Committee.

Councillor Brimm was a member of the Licensing Board and the Boundary and Electoral Arrangements Working Party and so the Thanet Independent Councillors Group need to make new nominations to both of these Committees.

We have also been informed by the Leader that he wishes to change his nominations to the Joint Transportation Board and would like to replace Councillor Parsons with Councillor M Saunders.

3.5 **Option 3**

That the Thanet Independent Councillors Group loses a seat on the Planning Committee and so must remove a nomination to that Committee. The UKIP group gain a seat on the Planning Committee and so must make a new nomination to that committee. That a seat is removed from the Governance and Audit Committee and the Thanet Independent Councillors Group lose that seat and so must remove a nominee from that Committee. That a seat is added to the General Purposes Committee and that seat is given to the Conservative Group and so they will need to make a new nomination to that Committee.

Councillor Brimm was a member of the Licensing Board and the Boundary and Electoral Arrangements Working Party and so the Thanet Independent Councillors Group need to make new nominations to both of these Committees.

4.1 If there are any changes to group nominations that would mean subsequent changes to Chairmanships or Vice-Chairmanships, then the Council would need to make new nominations to those positions.
