The premises are primarily a vaping shop. It is proposed to have a very small bar and area for consumption at the rear of the shop which will be capable of supervision by the shop proprietors and the DPS. The shop is already fitted with CCTV, which will be adjusted to make sure the alcohol sales and consumption area is covered. The only area outside the premises where alcohol may be consumed will be the enclosed yard at the rear of the premises, where smokers will go, rather than on the frontage in Northdown Road.
b) The prevention of crime and disorder
The premises are small and very readily supervised. The alcohol consumption area in within the premises, not at the frontage.
c) Public safety
The premises were formerly a Solicitors office, All the usual risk assessments have been carried out and adjusted to take account of the new dual use as a Vape shop and small bar.
d) The prevention of public nuisance
The area where alcohol will be consumed is well within the premises and in the rear yard. It is unlikely that any public nuisance will be caused.
e) The protection of children from harm


