Prevention of Crime & Disorder	The current conditions of serving alcohol only with meals and that suitable alternative beverages should be available as ancillary to meals should NOT be removed. The existing late hours for closing with the removal of these conditions means that the premises become a Public House. The premises are situated in a quiet family beachside area in extremely close proximity to residential properties. The increased availability of alcohol, off sales and long opening hours created by the removal of these conditions creates the potential for anti social behaviour, crime and disorder in and around a confined area that includes family friendly beaches and beach huts as well as residential properties for retired and vulnerable people.

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# Prevention of Public Nuisance

In the current licensing framework the excessive opening hours would not be granted. The remove the conditions in the application would permit the sale of alcohol on and for consumption off the premises to such an extent that the premises would become Public House. The proximity of the premises to a quiet residential area would inevitably cause Public Nuisance due to the noise from leaving the premises after unrestricted consumption of alcohol. There will be increased traffic from customers and deliveries causing parking and access issues. More alcohol will be consumed in the vicinity and the wider environment of the beach area caused by cans bottles and general rubbish.

# Protection of Children from Harm

If the conditions are removed then the nature of the premises will be changed to a Public House. There will need to be clear arrangements in regard to safeguarding the well being of children and young people should the conditions be removed.

## **Public Safety**

In the event of removal of these conditions permitting the consumption of alcohol seven days per week from 10 am to midnight public safety will be compromised. Access to the premises is via an already congested narrow street this would make it difficult for emergency vehicles, Local Authority waste disposal vehicles and increased volume of delivery vans. The increased access to alcohol will increase the workload for beach inspectors and lifesavers. Behaviour exhibited by those who have unrestricted access to alcohol will change the nature of the area. In addition existing access and or planned changes to the sea wall flood defences would represent a threat to local

Prevention of Crime & Disorder	The license that already exists for these premises which was granted in 2005 allows for them to be open until midnight. This is late and at the previous hearing on the variation of this license the environmental officer said that if the license was being sought today they would not allow the excessive late hours. Taking this into account if the current conditions of only serving alcohol with meals was removed this would allow customers to be drinking for a long period of time. This I feel, in what is predominantly a residential area would give rise to customers leaving the premises and a heightened chance of public disorder and crime occurring. This quiet residential area of Westgate On Sea does not really have the need for what would effectively be a seafront bar/pub.

# Prevention of Public Nuisance

Unfortunately the existing license which was granted in the past allows for excessively late hours already. A condition was also imposed at the last hearing for all doors and windows to the premises to be closed at 9.00pm to cut down on noise levels. If the condition of serving alcohol to customers who are eating a meal is removed, this would allow anyone to drink alcohol at any time and for as long as they wanted. This will inevitably cause a public nuisance. If people are then allowed to effectively just drink, along with the added risk of off sales for passing trade the impact on the surrounding area, which is a family beach area not a High Street, I feel will allow for excessive noise of people socialising until late into the night which would be a public nuisance. I am concerned that when customers leave the premises this will generate extra noise. For instance slamming of car doors and loud voices. This was the case when The Knot (public house in Beach Road) was open. People would leave late, singing and shouting and acting in an unruly way. Especially in the warm Summer evenings (when the residences will have windows open to keep cool) they would encourage groups to congregate making even more noise and disquarding bottles and other litter. This potentially will be the case if the condition is lifted.

People come to this corner of Westgate to relax and enjoy the unspoilt bay, having no distractions like amusements etc just the natural surrounding beach. They feel this is a safe and family friendly beach for children to play freely without any worries. This is why for as long as I can remember what was PAVs was a traditional beach café which was brilliant for families to have ice cream and refreshments from. With off sales being available and people effectively taking alcohol onto the beach this could also cause potential for public nuisance behaviour and also litter problems. Not to mention broken glass on what is one of our blue flag beaches. Therefore keeping the restrictive condition of only serving alcohol whilst eating a meal on the premises I feel should remain.

Protection of Children from Harm

The potential for harm to children will be if the people can then drink during the day unlimited also taking this onto the beach, leaving rubbish and potential for broken glass being left on the beach.

Public Safety	The condition for serving alcohol with meals should remain otherwise anyone can enter the premises and then choose to drink for best part of the day and into the evening. Public safety would then become an issue as groups of people drunk and wandering about the promenade especially late at night and at high tide could cause real issues and harm to themselves.

This is already too late and at the previous hearing on the variation of this license the environmental officer said that if the license was being sought today they would not allow these excessive late hours. Taking this into account, if the current conditions of only serving alcohol with meals was removed this would allow customers to drink for much longer periods of time. This will also lead to people sitting on the beach and drinking in the sun all day. We all know how badly drunks can behave if challenged over their behaviour.

## Prevention of Public Nuisance

Unfortunately the existing license which was granted in the past allows for excessively late hours, therefore a condition was imposed at the last hearing for all doors and windows to the premises be closed at 9.00pm to stop noise pollution. Which I can't see working as every time somebody goes in and out the building the noise will filter out. People will be standing outside smoking till all hours of the night, which will also constitute as noise pollution.

If the condition of serving alcohol only to customers who are eating a meal is removed, this would make it possible for anybody to buy alcohol, at any time, and for as long as they wanted. This will undoubtedly cause a public nuisance.

Having an establishment selling alcohol till late at night will definitely bring people to the area at night, solely for the purpose of buying alcohol. This is a quiet little road that is used predominantly by residents or their visitors so not much traffic, which means our vehicles and the residents are safe at night.

I am concerned that when customers leave at night this will generate extra noise too, example slamming of car doors and loud voices.

People come to this corner of Westgate to relax and enjoy the unspoilt, tranquillity of the beach, and not have noise from amusement arcades or shops selling tourist knick knacks.

## Protection of Children from Harm

The potential for broken glass on the promenade and on the beach would be hugely increased. There are always children and adults walking up and down on the promenade buying ice creams, cold drinks, chips etc. Families play games on the beach and the last thing you want is to be looking our broken glass all the time. Having drunks on the beach when there are always lots of children around is not acceptable.

## **Public Safety**

This is a tidal beach and the water comes right up to the wall at high tide, this could potentially become an issue as the front door is not very far from the ocean wall or slipway. Drunks and water don't mix, we've seen what happened at the Margate Harbour a few years ago. Has

anybody consulted the RNLI with regards this potential new threat? Having alcohol sold at night on a quiet, dark beach is
asking for disaster.



With a late licence already in place and patrons able to drink over an increased period of time and no necessity to eat, this would increase the noise pollution and chances of crime and disorder in a predominately quiet residential area.

# Prevention of Public Nuisance

Borne out by the environmental officer's statement "that this would not be granted if it was being sought today".

Times have changed since this licence was originally granted and I believe that residents and visitors alike, have the right to a calm and peaceful lifestyle/holiday. Removing these conditions would change this area and that lifestyle dramatically if the customers are allowed to drink alcohol for as long as they wanted and without it having to be accompanied by food.

The existing licence already allows for excessively late hours.

wanted and without it having to be accompanied by food.
This would certainly cause a public nuisance, due to the undoubted increase in noise levels from loud voices, car doors slamming and the unruly behaviour of people who have had too much to drink.

It would also mean that residents would be unable to have their windows open on summer evenings, due to noise levels from the St. Mildreds Bay Bar and also the noise of passing trade requiring off sales.

# Protection of Children from Harm

If people are drinking all day, this will have an effect on children who witness this. Families go to the beach to relax and for their children to have fun. They will not want the worry about their children being near people who have had too much to drink.

The outside drinking areas will be directly adjacent (a matter of 1m) to council rented beach huts where families with children don't expect to be sitting on top of a pub garden.

## **Public Safety**

The condition of meals being served with alcohol needs to remain. Public safety would be an issue with customers who have had too much to drink being near a promenade and the sea late at night. There is potential for them to come to harm.

Due to the extreme closeness to the beach there will always be many children around. The trulding runs parallel to the narrow promenade / beach. 



We have very united off-street parking where we live which means that we are often forced to park in St Mildredo Gardens or surrounding streets. This is often not possible because of the visitas using this area instead of the car park which, I hasten to add, remains deserted 24/7, as no one will pay to park when they can do it for free. This will just get worse! Surely there are enough drinking establishments within the Westgate Town without spoiling a apriet residential area by opening yet another premises with extended drinking hours.

## Prevention of Public Nuisance

It is unreasonable to expect residents in a quiet residential area to tolerate a change from a cafe which closes at 5pm to a bar with late evening opening hours. Flats at St Mildreds Gardens overlook the cafe (unlike adjacent Millies Bar which is not closely overlooked by any residential area)

No matter how considerate diners/drinkers are on leaving premises there is always disturbance from doors/car doors and conversations. St Mildreds Bay cafe is a narrow road width from the flats at St Mildreds Gardens

Parking: The narrow roads in the area are already busy with residents, beach users, Millies Bar parking. Music, no matter how restrained, is bound to be audible with open doors and windows in summer. This is unacceptable to residents in a quiet residential area. Often the base beats are audible and unpleasant to people living above.

## Protection of Children from Harm

St Mildreds Bay is known as a family destination where children are playing on the beach, where, at present, there is no danger from drinking/strong language/bad behaviour/glass and other debris. Children living in the residential area overlooking the St Mildreds Bay would be disturbed if late opening was allowed, as late evening opening hours would be beyond the children's bedtimes.

There is also the likelihood of minors on the beach going into the bar to buy alcohol. Would photo identification be required from all unaccompanied customers that appear to be under the age of 21 years?

#### **Public Safety**

The promenade is well used by walkers, runners, cyclists as well as families with children and dogs, and unsuitable for any expansion/seating on the sea side. Any change to the sea side aspect or any raising of the height of the building would put people at risk. During the winter the sea can come right across the promenade at this point. (again compare with Millies Beach Bar which is set further back)

Research evidence indicates that it is the young adult age group who are most likely to be involved in crime and disorder and the most likely to binge drink.  The highest proportion of all weekend violent crime occurs on Friday and Saturday nights between 9pm and 3am (39% and 41% respectively), according to figures from 28 police forces in England and Wales – times when people tend to drink more, and are more likely to move their drinking to licensed premises, including 'vertical drinking' establishments "where drinking is an end in itself rather than an

accompaniment to other activities such as having a meal while seated at a table".

Excessive drinking combined with adverse factors within and just outside venues can fuel aggressive behaviour and violence. Citing this World Health Organization report, the Institute of Alcohol Studies says adverse factors include: crowding; poor bar layout and traffic flow; inadequate seating or inconvenient bar access; dim lighting and noise

## Prevention of Public Nuisance

The siting of the premises is within a residential area with a whole range of individuals including older people, families with babies and children. Noise, including music, loud conversations, shouting and noise associated with the catering industry need to be restricted to an hour where people's sleep patterns are unaffected. An additional nuisance, which has already been an issue to the local residents, is bright lights which again have affected the ability to sleep. Without security measures in place, there will be issues with patrons spilling out on to the promenade and therefore affecting people walking, running and riding along the promenade.

The other establishment adjacent to The St. Mildred's Bay does not have this issue as there is a large outdoor fenced area for patrons and they have the ability to open their glass doors in the summer to give an open view.

Opening Hours of this other establishment are:

Monday Closed

Tuesday 9am-7pm

Wednesday 9am-7pm

Thursday 9am-7pm

Friday 9am-10pm

Saturday 9am-10pm

Sunday 9am-6pm

These hours are reasonable and acceptable for the residential area

Finbar's of West Bay which is not directly in a residential area closes at 10 pm and therefore people, who have parked their cars on the residential roads close to the restaurant will be leaving at a reasonable time.

The Licensing Authority must make objective judgements to attach conditions to a licence to ensure that any such conditions will primarily focus on the direct impact of the activities taking place at licensed premises on members of the public living or otherwise engaged in normal activity in the vicinity. These conditions will be the responsibility of the licensee who must understand and accept the needs and the social environment of the local

community.

## Protection of Children from Harm

St Mildred's Bay is a space used by families and allowing a drinking establishment offering all day and late night alcohol availability will attract adults who will not necessarily show the responsibility needed when in the presence of young people. Alcohol has a profound effect on the complex structures of the brain. It blocks chemical signals between brain cells leading to the common immediate symptoms of intoxication, including impulsive behaviour, slurred speech, poor memory, and slowed reflexes. This does not fit well with young people playing on the beach, walking on the promenade and buying ice creams and other foods. These two types of socialising do not mix well together and raise the risk factor.

## **Public Safety**

As it gets dark, the health and safety of the public becomes more of an issue. This is particularly pertinent as cycle restrictions are lifted at 6.00 pm on the promenade which is immediately adjacent to the entrances and exits of St. Mildred's Bay which raises the risk of accidents..

There are railings on the promenade for public safety along the promenade but these do not extend to the slipway opposite the St. Mildred's Bay which raises the risk level to customers who may be under the profound effects of drinking alcohol as stated in the previous paragraph.

The mixing of people who would be attracted to a premises which offers all day and late night drinking and families enjoying the beach is not a great plan. The tide also means that people from the beach have to retire to the promenade at certain times which exacerbates this potential issue

	If the current conditions of only serving alcohol with meals was removed this would allow customers to be drinking for a long period of time which would affect the residential area and the beach which is currently free of crime and disorder. With customers leaving the customers the premises at a late hour and with alcohol being served over

a long period of time will massively heightened the probability of public disorder and crime occurring. This quiet residential area of Westgate On Sea seafront is a safe family beach area. If this allowed you only have to look at what has happened in Margate to see what will follow here.

## Prevention of Public Nuisance

Unfortunately the existing license which was granted in the past allows for excessively late hours already. A condition was also imposed at the last hearing for all doors and windows to the premises to be closed at 9.00pm to cut down on noise levels. If the condition of serving alcohol to customers who are eating a meal is removed, this would allow anyone to drink alcohol at any time and for as long as they wanted. This will inevitably cause a public nuisance. If people are then allowed to effectively just drink, along with the added risk of off sales for passing trade the impact on the surrounding area, which is a family beach area not a High Street. People causing noise socialising until late into the night which would be a public nuisance that is less that a stones throw from my house.

I am also concerned that when customers leave the premises this will generate extra noise with the slamming of car doors and loud voices. This was the case when The Knot (public house in Beach Road) was open. People would leave late, singing and shouting and acting in an unruly way. Especially in the warm Summer evenings (when the residences will have windows open to keep cool) they would encourage groups to congregate making even more noise and disguarding bottles and other litter. This potentially will be the case if the condition is lifted.

People come to this corner of Westgate to relax and enjoy the unspoilt bay, having no distractions like amusements etc just the natural surrounding beach. They feel this is a safe and family friendly beach for children to play freely without any worries.

My husband has terminal cancer and relies on this calm quiet place to recover and have his best quality of life — this would massively be affected with the noise generated from this location.

A traditional beach café that caters for families is what is required. With off sales being available and people effectively taking alcohol onto the beach this could also cause potential for public nuisance behaviour and also litter problems. Not to mention broken glass on what is one of our blue flag beaches. Therefore keeping the restrictive

There is a very real concern that if off sales are permitted then there will be a potential for anti-social behaviour, crime and disorder in and around a confined area which includes the beach and beach huts where there are elderly and unaccompanied/ unsupervised young people who could be vulnerable to inappropriate behaviour.

## Prevention of Public Nuisance

The locality being a quiet residential area would clearly change with the introduction of unfettered access to alcohol through extended opening without restrictions by way of increased noise from patrons both at the premises (particularly if they are allowed outside) and on leaving the premises for some time after it closes. There will be additional rubbish to be stored the noisy disposal of empty containers resulting additional traffic. More alcohol will be consumed in the vicinity and the wider environment resulting further rubbish through the inconsiderate disposal of cans bottles and general rubbish.

## Protection of Children from Harm

If this ill-considered proposal should succeed there is concern that the wellbeing of young people and vulnerable people will be harmed and clear safeguarding arrangements should be instigated as the proposal will effectively create a public house on the beach.

## **Public Safety**

Should the proposed application be successful the long hours stretching late into the night will change the nature of the area and will compromise public safety with the consumption of alcohol seven days per week from 10 am to midnight.

The narrow roads with parking on both sides will make access for emergency vehicles, local authority waste disposal vehicles and the additional commercial waste disposal vehicles problematic particularly with two 90-degree corners to navigate and the parking as congested is it is being by the beach. The greater ease with which to buy alcohol will increase the work load for the lifeguards, which will put beach users (predominantly families with young children) at greater risk from not only having lifeguards dealing with intoxicated bathers but from broken bottles and debris finding its way on to the beach and promenade where people will be barefooted.

There should be no changes to the sea wall flood defences until a report from the Environment Agency confirms that it would not represent a threat to the neighbouring properties.

Re: Mr Paul Glicksman – The St. Mildreds Bay, Beach Road, Westgate (formely Pavs Café)

I am writing to you in connection with the above and the application made to vary the licensing for the above premises.

I have recently purchased Westgate on Sea, which is immediately facing The St Mildreds (formerly Pavs Café), with my future retirement plans in mind. The position of the flat and the surrounding area were matters taken into consideration when I purchased the flat. Having only owned the flat for a few months I have found that most of my neighbours are of a similar age and have a similar mindset (ie the immediate area is home to mostly retired people or those nearing retirement like myself).

The beach is frequented mainly by families with your children and older people with dogs and I can see the feel of the area changing if the application in question is accepted. Safety issues may be taken into consideration also as this quiet residential area is not designed or capable of supporting additional traffic, including delivery and emergency vehicles.

The application referred to above is simply not in keeping with the area or its unique feel and to allow the changes requested would be highly detrimental to those living in, and enjoying the area. From my relatively short period of owning a flat at Marine Heights I am familiar with several, bars, restaurants and off licenses etc in the vicinity and see no need for another establishment of this type.

#### Live Music Inside

This would cause noise pollution and parking issues due to proximity of the venue to the flats and accommodation opposite, not just due to the music, but also the attendees exiting. In addition parking (which is already at a premium), would be an issue and would probably mean either residents or customers of The St Mildreds spilling over into West Bay Avenue. There are already parking issues due to customers of Millies (adjacent to The St Mildreds). In addition the proposed timings are not acceptable for this residential area.

### Recorded Music Inside

The same comments mentioned above apply here too.

#### Recorded Music Outside

Again the comments above apply, but even more so with regard to noise pollution due to external speakers playing music.

### Performances of Dance Inside

I assume that this is indicating that the intention is to use the building as a nightclub "as definition of dance" could include this. The area is simply not suitable for a nightclub and the parking/infrastructure facilities do not support this.

#### Late Night Refreshments Inside

This would again change the feel of the area and the attraction of owning and living in the area. This is a beach front and a change of a beachside café to a nightclub/off license/bar would seriously deter people from living in (and visiting) the area and would attract a different type of visitor and occupier.

### Late Night Refreshments Outside

The previous comments apply here, but even more so – Why would anyone enjoying the views of the sea want to look out to see people potentially inebriated and rowdy and have all the noise disturbance which goes with it?

#### Supply of Alcohol - On Sales

I have no issue with this on the basis that this is limited to the times that Milles (adjacent to The St Mildreds) is permitted to operate.

### Supply of Alcohol - Off Sales

This is tantamount to having an off license and again this would cause issues with parking. There is often no parking spaces available on Beach Road and whilst the residents of Marine Heights have an allocated parking space, this does not allow for relatives or friends visiting and often there are no spaces available. In view of the nature of Beach Road at this point and the narrowness of the road between the parked cars this would also cause issues entering and exiting Beach Road, as well as safety issues.

#### Films

The parking issues again are relevant here, and potentially noise pollution. I am not exactly sure what is meant by films, and can only assume that this may relate

to music videos which are often played in bars and clubs. If films that are shown in a cinema are intended, then this may have an affect on the Carlton Cinema in the town, which would be heartbreaking.

## Opening Hours

The proposed opening hours are totally unacceptable. This would mean that every waking hour the premises would be in operation and this can surely not be acceptable in a wholly residential area.

I trust that you will understand the reasons why I strongly object to the proposals, and that the application is rejected/dismissed.
