The Police wish to make representation to this application to remove the 2 x conditions as stated above.

This premises have been used as a restaurant, however an application was received by the police 24/01/2020 for the premises to be used as a public house with off and on sales of alcohol. Whilst the police had no evidence to support a representation at the time, we did not have sight of subsequent additional amendments to the original application which have since been granted.

For the change of use to a pub / late night venue the Annex 2 conditions could be deemed not relevant. However, the main concern is with regards to these premises having requested alcohol both off and on the premises.

Currently these premises have the approval and authority for alcohol sales both off & on premises. These premises are very close to the beach and local residents. This beach is used by residents all year round and holiday makers when the weather allows. Under the current conditions any alcohol sold from these premises within the times allowed could be in open vessels, most likely glass. There is no obligation or condition that the pub would be required to collect or even remove such glassware from the beach. As a result, if these glasses are left uncollected, they could be broken and create a safety hazard to people, including children, dogs, and wildlife and increasing pollution in the area.

Therefore, the prevention of public nuisance, public safety and protection of children from harm objectives would be compromised if this variation to remove the conditions relating to off-sales is granted. This would be the only premises in St Mildred's Bay allowed to sell alcohol for consumption off premises in open vessels. An increase in the availability of alcohol in open vessels is likely to also create an increased nuisance for local residents from evening beach parties and other gatherings and increase the risk of underage drinking by those attracted to the area due to the above availability in the evenings. The premises owners and operators must be aware of their responsibilities regarding the promotion of the licensing objectives.

With regards to this variation, S.35 (4) of the Licensing Act 2003 allows, in addition to the option of rejecting the application, for the modification of any of the conditions of the licence.

The police therefore request that if the existing conditions are removed the following conditions are added to mitigate the impact.

- 1. "ALL OFFSALES WILL BE IN SEALED CONTAINERS, CANS OR BIO-DEGRADABLE CONTAINERS, NOT GLASS" is added as a safeguard to the above explained risks to public safety.
- 2. "NO OFF SALES AFTER 19:00 HOURS EACH DAY
