Licensing Objective	Reason for Representation
Prevention of Crime & Disorder	<p>This licence would allow for the supply of alcohol up to four o'clock in the morning for indoor sporting events.</p> <p>This means that, for instance, international football or boxing or MMA matches held overseas could be screened late at night and into the wee small hours with alcohol sold to spectators (where the venues profits are boosted by the volume of sales).</p> <p>Spectators would then be turned out - in a highly volatile state - onto the streets of Margate with no way of getting home for several hours until public transport starts to run. Those who have driven to the site will be tempted to attempt to drive home when they are in no fit state to do so and are a danger to themselves and the public at large, including emergency workers, milk delivery workers and others who have to be on the roads early in the morning.</p>

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Prevention of Public Nuisance	This licence would allow for up to four events comprising four consecutive days every year with music and alcohol available until four o'clock in the morning. This would constitute what most people would consider to be a music festival and would encourage people to come to Dreamland for the whole four days with the intention of sleeping on the beach for the five hours from 4am to 9am until they can get back in to Dreamland for the next days music. Given the state of Glastonbury after the festival, the cost to the local community would be immense.
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Protection of Children from Harm	
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Public Safety	The various terms in the licence applied for clearly allow for a constant parade of events turning people out on to the streets at any time from 11pm to 4 in the morning in a state of intoxication, volatility and vulnerability. And this on 365 days a year including those when there is no public transport running to disperse the people who have attended events.
