Licensing Objective	Reason for Representation
Prevention of Crime & Disorder	<p>I object to the extension of this license to any time after public transport has stopped. It is clear that aside from those living in the locality, large crowds leaving any venue after this time would need to use cars or walk. Whilst there are car park facilities available, the majority will leave by train or bus. Between midnight and 4am, when no public transport is available, this will mean large groups of attendees congregating in the vicinity either to wait for transport to start again or to look for further entertainment locally.</p> <p>A PSPO is in place in the area surrounding Dreamland. I question whether there are sufficient authorised officers available to 'police' these orders and to prevent activities most commonly associated with excess alcohol or drug use. The presence of authorised officers serves as a deterrent to anti-social behaviours. Officers need to patrol the area in order</p>

	that a PSPO is more than just a paper exercise and to evidence that behaviour associated with excessive alcohol and drug use is curtailed, by taking the appropriate enforcement action?
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Prevention of Public Nuisance	<p>Having lived in Arlington House for the last 5 years, I am aware that the current number of outdoor and indoor music events at Dreamland cause discomfort, annoyance and hindrances to the residents of this block. The noise levels regularly exceed permissible levels and I have had cause to make complaints about this which has necessitated the TDC sound engineer visiting my flat to witness and confirm this. Even in a flat with secondary glazing, the noise levels prevented sleeping, interfered with the general enjoyment of living in the property and prevented working/listening to music/radio etc. With a number of children living in this block and with many residents being elderly or sick, sleep disturbance is not just an annoyance but can be detrimental to health. Extending the permissible hours and days at this venue can only increase this environmental nuisance.</p> <p>To date, Dreamland have failed to respond constructively to complaints from Arlington House about noise levels. There is a history of breaching the current arrangements. I therefore object to any increase in the frequency of events or extension to permissible hours.</p> <p>It is worth noting that this venue was never designed to host the number and frequency of large music events. Most national outdoor venues are not in residential neighbourhoods and have on-site or local facilities to stay overnight or camp. In terms of indoor music events in Margate, it was the Winter Gardens, which was specifically designed to host this type of entertainment.</p>
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Protection of Children from Harm	<p>As above, children should be afforded a home environment free from noise and interference.</p> <p>Performances by acts which may be of a lewd or sexual nature or contain strong or offensive language are not uncommon and these have the potential to be heard and seen from Arlington flats and by those teenagers/children who regularly witness concerts from the perimeter car parks.</p>
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	<p>Relevant to this application are the safeguards which are or will be put in place to check proof of age, adequate security and trained staff to operate this scheme and properly tested and practiced evacuation procedures in the event that disturbances break out. Lessons should be learnt from the hosting of on-screen sporting events in such confined venues where alcohol is sold as evidenced at Dreamland during the televised football match last year.</p>
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<p>Public Safety</p>	<p>PSPO orders are in place to prevent nuisance or harassment to the public. As above, large groups are prohibited from congregating under such orders. Extending the license for this venue will inevitably mean that there are more occasions and lengthier times that officers need to be available and visible in this area in order to enforce these regulations. If this is not possible or not considered a priority then public safety is likely to be compromised.</p>
