Prevention of Public Nuisance	<p>In addition to the points made by A Better Arlington, it is not only the Eastern façade flats that have been adversely affected by excessive noise at late hours emanating from the Dreamland Estate. Noise is reflected by the Rollercoasterhouse building and particularly affects the middle part of the Western façade of Arlington House.</p> <p>Given the apparent difficulty the Dreamland operators have of keeping within the noise limits set and in detecting breaches and the greater difficulty Thanet District council seem to have in</p>
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	enforcing the limits, the only way fo ensuring adequate control is for the installation of automatic power braekers that cut off power the the sound system in the event of a breach and prevent re-instatement of power for a 10-minute period. This provides the incentive to not cause breaches in the first place and reemoves the affort of council officers in implementation. I am angry that, yet again, Thanet District council have not facilitated public consultation in this matter: there have been no roadside notices in the affected area, there have been no letters to local residents (council tax payers and voters) likelt to be affected: the period for representation and access to the information regarding the application has been adversely curtailed by holiday closures and restricted access - worthy yet again of the Hitchikers' Guide to the Galaxy
